

# **CALL FOR APPLICATIONS**

Journalists reporting on security, small arms and light weapons (SALW) and gender-based violence affairs

Study Visit, in March<sup>1</sup> 2024, Stockholm Sweden

### Rationale/ Background

The OSCE Presence in Albania supports the Republic of Albania's efforts in preventing and combating SALW proliferation, thus contributing to the national and regional security and stability, while remaining committed in its mandate to promote freedom of expression, thus partnering with media is crucial for the organization.

The project "Assisting the national authorities of the Republic of Albania to decrease the risk of weapon proliferation and misuse of SALW" – implemented by OSCE Presence in Albania and funded by the European Union, the Federal Republic of Germany and the Republic of France – is addressing one of the priority areas identified from the project's main partners, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) and the Albanian State Police (ASP), such as raising public awareness of the dangers of misuse and proliferation of SALW.

In the framework of the SALW project, the Awareness Raising and Communication Strategy on the Misuse of Small Arms and Light Weapons and Action Plan has been developed and delivered to the Ministry of Interior and Albanian State Police for their follow up and implementation Following the Strategy the SALW project in cooperation with the MOI and ASP will conduct awareness raising and outreach activities on the risk of the misuse of SALW.

In this process, the media is considered to play a vital role and is a strategic partner. In addition, the media are a key factor on informing and educating the public, by directly contributing to the ROADMAP<sup>2</sup> goal four which states "By 2024, significantly reduce the supply, demand and misuse of firearms through increased awareness, education, outreach and advocacy".

In this regard, the Presence will continue to support journalists covering the security, SALW and gender- based violence affairs in Albania, with the aim to increase and reinforce the role of media in the public awareness raising campaigns, assess the reporter's needs to enhance the quality of reporting based on the EU best practices.

Following the Media Exchange Visit in Belgrade organized December 2022 and as continuance of the OSCE efforts to enhance the media engagement while addressing the security issues in

Albania, the Presence will organize a second exchange study visit for a selected number of Albanian journalists (from print, TV, radio and online media outlets). The **three-day** exchange visit will be organized in Stockholm, Sweden, in March 2024.

Sweden is the world's first country to have adopted a press freedom law, dated in 1766, as well as traditionally holds media independence in great respect<sup>3</sup>. In addition, Sweden implements various innovative awareness raising activities and outreach activities with different target groups on the crime prevention.

The study visit will focus on media engagement practices in awareness raising and outreach activities reporting standards, capacity building and partnership between media, government authorities, local and international organizations.
