





Expected key outcomes

Modern, high-quality national public procurement legal framework, based on the 2011 UNCITRAL ML standards but tailored to the country context and compliant with the 2012 WTO Government Procurement Agreement

Public Procurement Reform Challenges

- Scope extent of public sector
- Which procurement methods are appropriate and whether conditions for use need to be tightened
- · Whether to provide for framework agreements
- · Whether to conduct public procurement electronically
- Extent to which review decisions can be made public in effective way
- · Whether to permit preferences (free trade context)
