
# **Municipal Offices for Communities** and Return (MOCRs) 2019


Municipal Offices for Communities and Return are obligatory for all municipalities and are mandated to protect communities' rights, ensure equal access to services and create conditions for sustainable return. MOCRs directly report to the mayor, and the size of the office and number of posts is determined by the percentage of communities residing in the municipality and their needs, as well as the number of planned or expected returnees or repatriated persons. Since their introduction in 2010, MOCRs have been established formally in 35 municipalities. Key documents regulating the establishment and mandate of the MOCRs are Regulation 02/2010 for the municipal offices for communities and return and MOCR Terms of Reference - Standard Operating Procedures.

### Establishment


Since their introduction in 2010, MOCRs have been established in 35 municipalities. In Leposavić/Leposaviq, Mitrovica/Mitrovicë North, and Zubin Potok, similar offices serving similar functions exist and are not counted as MOCRs in this factsheet



#### **Gender Representation of MOCRs by Community**




#### **Community Representation of MOCR Officers**






## Performance 2019
