# LATEST NEWS

- The Special Monitoring Mission (SMM) recorded a lower number of ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions between 20 April and 11 May compared to the previous reporting period, particularly since the beginning of Mav.
- Monitors continued to observe heavy weapons in use and present in the . security zone in violation of withdra wal lines and recorded significant number of weapons as missing from holding areas and permanent storage sites.
- The Mission observed the presence of numerous weapons in violation of the respective withdrawal lines on 9 May parades in Donetsk and Luhansk cities.
- The SMM faced further restrictions to its freedom of movement, particularly in areas not controlled by the Government. The SMM was restricted from monitoring the border in "LPR"-controlled areas on a number of occasions.
- Four civilians were killed close to a "DPR" checkpoint near Olenivka when shelling occurred in the early hours of 27 April. See the Spot Report at: www.osce.org/ukraine-smm/236936.
