Deputy Mayor for Communities

The Deputy Mayor for Communities (DMCs) is a local protection mechanism obligatory in municipalities where communities in a numerical minority make up at least ten per cent of the municipality's population. Upon the decision of the Municipal Assembly (MA), it can also be established in municipalities where the population of communities in a numerical minority does not meet the ten percent threshold. The DMC candidate is proposed by the Mayor and approved by the MA. The DMC is mandated to provide advice and guidance to the Mayor on issues related to communities and should represent all communities residing in the municipality.





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Overall Performance

DMCs' performance scores are based the aggregated results of on performance indicators, which reflect key activities and substantive duties provided for in the relevant legal and policy framework. Performance is rated "High", when the aggregated score is above 66 per cent, "Moderate", when it ranges between 66 per cent and 33 per cent, and "Low", when below 33 per cent.

The OSCE Mission in Kosovo supports improved communities' participation in public decision- making and governance processes and institutions. To assist in this effort the OSCE Mission in Kosovo regularly monitors the performance of municipal communities' protection mechanisms. These information sheets aim to provide the relevant institutions with indicators that can assist in identifying gaps and improvement in compliance.
