Municipal Offices for Communities and Return

Municipal Offices for Communities and Return (MOCRs) are obligatory for all municipalities and are mandated to protect communities' rights, ensure equal access to services and create conditions for sustainable return. MOCRs directly report to the mayor. The size and number of posts of MOCRs are determined by the percentage of communities residing in the municipality and their needs, as well as the number of planned or expected returnees or repatriated persons.



Establishment


MOCRs have been established in 35 municipalities.

In Leposavić/Leposaviq, Mitrovica/Mitrovicë North, and Zubin Potok similar offices serving similar functions exist and are not counted as MOCRs in this factsheet. Overall, MOCRs employ 136 officers and their average size is about 4 posts.



Communities and Gender representation

Women make up 32% of MOCRs employees. While Kosovo Serb and Kosovo Albanian officers make up respectively 38% and 23% of the total MOCRs posts, there is at least one officer belonging to each community in Kosovo.




