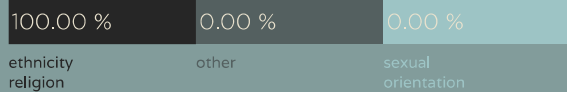

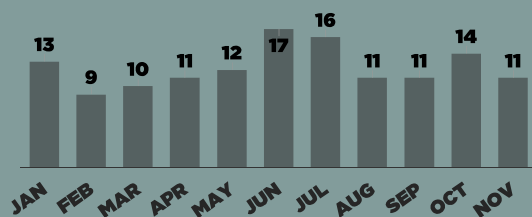

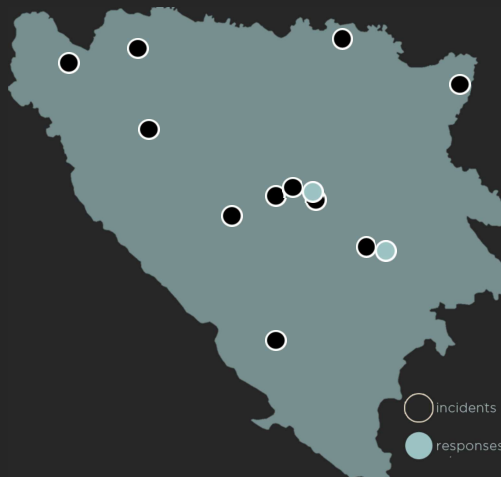

On 24 November, within the implementation of the Community Cohesion Action Plan of Brčko District BiH, the Coalition against Hate 'Promoviši pozitivno' (CaH) removed graffiti from several locations in Brčko District.
