Flood of 1997 in Lower Silesia


- Nainfall up to 500 mm in one week (average for 3-4 months)
- Water level in river beds exceeding historical levels by 2-3 meters

- 56 fatalities
- Total losses estimated at USD 3.5 billions
- Flood area over 665 000 ha
- ➤ Total or partial destruction of 680 000 appartments, 843 schools, 4000 bridges, 14 400 km of roads






Odra river basin



Total river basin area is 124 049 sq. km, of which:

- 86,4 % in Poland
- 5,9 % in Czech Republic
- 7,7 % in Germany













Improved weather forecasting



- Meteorolgical radars network
- Almost 1000 automatic metering stations
- Lightning detection system
- Automatic warnings for public under development



- Bilateral agreements on data transmission
- Direct contacts on operational level
- Information on significant discharges from reservoirs via phone or Internet
- Monitoring of websites of international partners (water management, meterological situation)





Strategic planning



- Flood protection studies
- Preliminary flood risk assessment (PFRA)
- Flood threat and flood risk maps
- Flood risk management plans (FRMP) under development



- Working groups under bilateral transboundary waters commissions
- Development of PFRA and FRMP by the International Commission for the Protection of Odra River





Flood protection infrastructure



- Programme for Odra river
- Odra river flood protection programme
- New Odra and Vistula rivers programme under development



- Investments on transboundary waters agreed under bilatera agreements
- Additional resources from International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Council of Europe Developmen Bank, European funds





Crisis management



- Improvement of procedures and ccoperation of services
- Investments in equipment
- System for exchange of information under development, targeted at different user groups



- Bilateral agreements between rescue services and on ice breaking
- Exchange of information, provision of translation
- Common rescue procedures
- Rescue exercises and conferences
